Workshop Sign Up – Sched.com

You will receive an email invitation to join the <u>Educator Conference Event</u> from an online event management tool called <u>Sched.com</u>. All attendees must log in and access the event in Sched in order to sign up for sessions and receive sessions-specific communications and resources.

In-Person Arrival and Check In

Check In will occur in the Galleria of the Memorial Arts Building at the Woodruff Arts Center from 8 AM – 9:15 AM each day, before the keynote begins at 9:30 AM. We recommend that participants arrive early, and plan for wiggle room around traffic and parking. Additionally, please note that participants only need to Check In once, upon first arrival to the conference.

The Woodruff Arts Center offers a great dining selection. Additionally, nearby Colony Square has an array of options for attendees who would like to go off campus to eat.

Parking and Directions

The Woodruff Arts Center is located at 1280 Peachtree Street, NE, Atlanta, GA 30309. The Arts Center is easily accessible via Public Transportation – the Arts Center MARTA Station is across the street from the Woodruff Arts Center on Arts Center Way.

Attendees who drive to the Educator Conference are responsible for their own parking. The <u>Woodruff</u> <u>Arts Center parking garage</u> is located on Arts Center Way, and spaces in the Arts Center parking garage will be available on a first-come, first-served basis at a reduced rate of \$10/day (discounted from \$18/day). If the Arts Center parking garage becomes full, additional parking is available at the Promenade parking garage, located on 15th Street, and the Boys & Girls Club, located on Peachtree Street across from the Woodruff Arts Center.

Please note that the Woodruff Arts Center Parking Garage will experience high-volume activity on Friday, June 2 in the afternoon, from 2:30 – 4:30 PM, as Alliance Theatre summer camp families will be on campus to enjoy final showcase performances before picking their campers up. As an option, Educator Conference participants are welcome to park in an alternative location in Midtown on Friday, to avoid delay upon exit at 3:15 PM, as well as leave parking spaces on campus available for families with small children.

Professional Learning Certificates
